### Music Ministry APB

We are so blessed here at Newport Presbyterian Church. The abundance of talent and the good hearted people who give of their talents to enhance worship are truly amazing.

Our music program is growing and expanding. With this growth comes a request for more volunteers. I would like to personally invite you to participate in one or more of our musical choirs and/or ensembles. Truly, no experience needed—a good heart and a love of worship required. Take a look at what is available to you, and let me know if what you would like to do:



**Bell Choir:** This does not require any prior musical experience. All ages are welcome! We have bells of all sizes. If you can count, you can ring! The sound of bells is joyous, and ringing is fun. We encourage anyone who would like to become involved with the music program, but not sure how, to consider ringing. Rehearsal time is not permanently set but is currently scheduled for 4:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoon.



**Chancel Choir:** A traditional choir, a community of singers of all ages 12 to 20 years old. We rehearse weekly; have biannual retreats and social events. We are a warm, welcoming community that takes a leadership role in leading worship in our traditional 11:00 a.m. service as well as special services throughout the year. Rehearsals and Thursday evenings from 7:30 to 9:15 p.m. Our annual retreat is August 29 and 30 at the Rainbow Lodge in North Bend.



**Praise Ensemble:** This is a brand new ensemble that will sing at our 8:45 a.m., informal service. The goal is to have approximately 12 singers. The ensemble will sing two to three services a month. The music will be more contemporary and will require some singing and music reading experience as rehearsals will be minimal. Rehearsal time will be determined once the ensemble is established.



**Praise Band:** This is the worship band that leads the praise songs in the informal, 8:45 a.m. service. We are looking for: a *lead* guitarist, other instrumentalists, percussionists, and a couple of vocalists who can harmonize and/or read music well. We would love to have enough players to have a rotation system available. The Praise Band rehearses on Thursday evenings from 6:00-7:30.



**Youth Music:** We sing, we play, we ring! The youth participate in special services such as youth Sunday, Thanksgiving Eve, Christmas Eve, and Easter. In addition, we are looking for youth who have experience playing instruments and are willing to play with the Praise Band.

As you can see, there are many opportunities for music participation at Newport. ## Fire alarm sounding? Exit now!

As part of our remodel, we now have a building-wide sprinkler system instead of our old pull stations and smoke detectors. That means the possibility of a false alarm is greatly reduced—no more children activating a pull station or construction worker creating smoke or dust and setting off a smoke detector.

The fire alarm is now activated only by heat triggering a sprinkler head to begin sprinkling.

What that means for us: If you hear the fire alarm, you must assume there is a fire and exit the building immediately. Our monitoring company will call the fire department.

# God Is Bigger than One Religion

## We seek to learn from other faiths as we share insights

Newport Church has been interested in interfaith issues for quite some time. We have invited speakers from other faith traditions, especially from Islam, to share with us in several adult education classes. These classes have been rich and informative. We have sent

representatives from Newport to the eastside Interfaith Fair for the past several years. All of this has given us a deep respect for other religions and their respective faith journeys. Many of us have come to see there is no one correct way to a living relationship with God. While we are firmly committed to our Christian approach to God, and happy to share our insights from that perspective, we are open to learn from others.

Some from Newport who attended this year's interfaith fair thought it was time to take the next step. They encouraged Newport to invite someone from another faith tradition to participate in worship with us. Hopefully several from that faith tradition would join us for worship as well. Our Worship Committee looked at this and agreed.

So, I have invited Jawad Khaki, President of the Iman Center in Kirkland, to do a "dialogue sermon" with me on August 16. I am meeting with him this week to plan out the details. I think we will choose a topic, such as peace or love, and then read passages from our own sacred texts, and then talk about that topic from our faith traditions. Jawad will read from the Koran and I will read from the Bible. That is all I know at this time. Things may change as we see what feels most

appropriate.

I am excited about this next step. While I know not all Christians agree with me on this, (not even all at Newport) I have come to see that God is bigger than any one religion. People of good faith from the world's enduring religions are all

searching for God, for that sacred reality known by many names. It feels more and more like arrogance when any one religion refuses to see other religions as legitimate in their own right. I don't think we need to blend the different religions into a hybrid religion. That is seldom helpful. We can, however, learn from each other if we speak from the depths of our own traditions. Certainly the world will be a whole lot more peaceful when people of good faith refuse to let religious differences flame sectarian violence. That is especially true of those religious traditions (Jewish, Christian, and Muslim) that all call Abraham their ancestor in the faith.

We, obviously, won't be having joint worship services very often. This may lead into some of us visiting Jawad's worship center, however. I hope as many as are able will make a point to come to worship on August 16<sup>th</sup>.

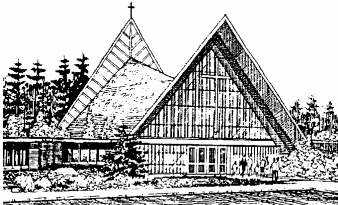
