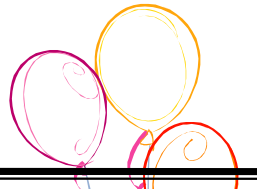

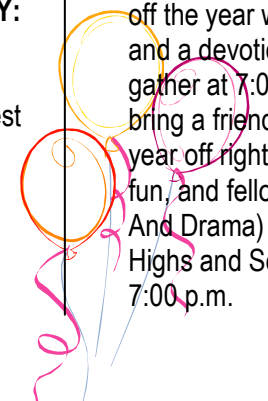
### Next Sunday, Sept. 20

## Volunteer and Mission Opportunities

- Newport is joining **Together We Build**, an Interfaith Coalition of Christians, Jews, and Muslims seeking to find common ground and learning from one another as we work together to build houses for low-income families in East King County. Together We Build will be working with Habitat for Humanity in their 8th annual build for six days in October. There will be building activities plus food preparation for a lunch served at the worksite each day. In addition, on October 11 there will be an Interfaith Worship Service. The build dates are October 9-11 and 15-17. Youth 16 and older are invited to join the build. Signups for each day will be limited due to the logistics of planning the build activities; you are encouraged to start planning which days you will attend. FASC has an on-going need for towels. They average 150 to 200 showers daily, and do approximately 80 loads of wash each day. The towels don't last long with constant washing. These are the only showers available for the growing number of street people in Seattle, and help prevent infections and the spread of disease.. New and gently used bath size towels may be placed in the Towel Bin in the Narthex.
